PALMER STATION WEATHER FORECAST INFORMATION

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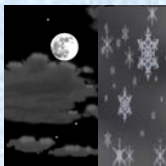
REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

The northern portion of the Antarctic Peninsula will be under a weak high pressure ridge today. A low pressure system will approach from the west across the Bellingshausen Sea tonight and Monday. Winds will increase modestly from the northeast to east ahead of this low on Monday, bringing a slight increase in temperatures. Intermittent light snow is likely later tonight and tomorrow.

Sky: Partly cloudy

Visibility (SM): Unrestricted, 1-3 in fog late afternoon

Wind (kts): Variable 4-8

Max Temp: 0°C / 32°F

Min Wind Chill: -10°C / 14°F

Sky: Partly cloudy early, becoming mostly cloudy

Visibility (SM): 1-3 in fog early, then 3-5 in snow and mist late

Wind (kts): NW-NE 6-12

Min Temp: -2°C / 28°F

Min Wind Chill: -11°C / 13°F

Sky: Cloudy

Visibility (SM): 4-6 in snow, occasional 2-4

Wind (kts): NE-E 15-25 gusts to 35

Max Temp: 2°C / 36°F

Min Wind Chill: -9°C / 16°F
