PALMER STATION WEATHER FORECAST INFORMATION

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REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

A strong low pressure system remains in the Bellingshausen Sea with troughs rotating around the low center and reaching the west coast of the Antarctic Peninsula. Indications are for continued strong gusty north-northeast winds with steady precipitation today then decreasing overnight. Expect stronger winds tomorrow with gusts up to 65 knots and periods of heavy precipitation.

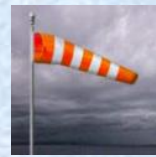

Wind (kts): N-NE 25-35 gusts to 40

Visibility (SM): 4-6, with periods of 1-2 in rain, fog/mist

Wind (kts): N-NE 20-30 gusts to 35

Min Temp: 3°C / 37°F

Min Wind Chill: -4°C / 25°F

Visibility (SM): 2-4, with periods of 1/4-1 in rain, fog/mist

Wind (kts): N-NE 30-40 gusts to 50, occasional NNE 40-50 gusts to 65
