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REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

A strong low pressure system moves from the Southern Ocean to the Bellingshausen Sea re-energizing the existing system with stronger winds along west coast of the Antarctic Peninsula. Indications are for strong gusty north-northeast winds up to 65 knots with steady precipitation today continuing overnight. Expect decreasing winds late tonight and tomorrow, with colder temps, as winds shift to the west.
