**PALMER STATION WEATHER FORECAST INFORMATION**

**REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY**

A low pressure system in the Bellingshausen Sea moves to the north-northeast passing near Anvers Island today and into Drake Passage tomorrow with a high pressure ridge filling in behind. Indications are for persistent precipitation with strong north-northeast winds today. Overnight and tomorrow expect winds becoming southeast with passage of the low center, precipitation ending, and decreasing temps.

**Sky:** Cloudy

**Visibility (SM):** 2-4, with periods of 1/2-2 in snow, blowing snow, fog/mist

**Wind (kts):** N-NE 20-30 gusts to 40

**Max Temp:** 1°C / 34°F

**Min Wind Chill:** -10 / 14°F

**Sky:** Cloudy

**Visibility (SM):** 3-5, with periods of 1/2-2 in snow, blowing snow, freezing fog/mist

**Wind (kts):** N-NE 15-20 gusts to 25, becoming E-SE 15-25 gusts to 30

**Min Temp:** -4°C / 25°F

**Min Wind Chill:** -12C / 10°F

**Sky:** Mostly Cloudy

**Visibility (SM):** Unrestricted, with periods of 2-4 in snow, freezing fog/mist ending early

**Wind (kts):** E-SE 15-20, becoming NW-N 5-10 late

**Max Temp:** -4°C / 25°F

**Min Wind Chill:** -10°C / 14°F
