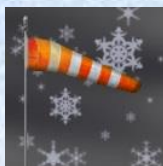
REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

A small but rather potent low pressure system will move into Palmer Land this afternoon and evening, preceded by increasing north winds, snow, and milder temperatures at Palmer Station. A cold front will bring colder temperatures and an end to the heavy snow and strong winds late tonight. Fair weather and cool temperatures are expected Monday as weak high pressure develops across the southern peninsula.
