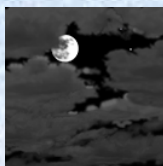
REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

Weak low pressure is crossing the Antarctic Peninsula and departing the area today. Snow and sleet will diminish today, and clouds will slowly start to break apart tonight and into tomorrow. Wind will also remain on the lighter side, as higher pressure temporarily takes over.

Visibility (SM): Unrestricted, occasionally 1 – 3 due to light snow, sleet, and mist

Wind (kts): SW 5 – 10

Max Temp: -4°C / 25°F

Min Wind Chill: -15°C / 5°F

Sky: Cloudy, becoming Mostly Cloudy

Visibility (SM): Unrestricted, occasionally 3 – 5 due to light snow and mist

Wind (kts): SW 5 – 10, becoming NE 5 – 10

Min Temp: -8°C / 18°F

Min Wind Chill: -15°C / 5°F

Sky: Mostly Cloudy, becoming Partly Cloudy

Visibility (SM): Unrestricted

Wind (kts): NE 8 – 12

Max Temp: -6°C / 21°F

Min Wind Chill: -16°C / 3°F
