REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

A weakening low pressure system is approaching the Antarctic Peninsula. Although winds will ramp up later tonight and bring a fair amount of rain, the gusty winds will have backed off by tomorrow, as the low continues to fall apart. Temperatures will be quite warm, due to the northerly flow.

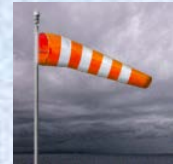

Sky: Cloudy

Visibility (SM): Unrestricted, occasionally 4 – 6 due to mist

Wind (kts): W 5-10

Max Temp: 4°C / 39°F

Min Wind Chill: 0°C / 32°F

Sky: Cloudy

Visibility (SM): Unrestricted, becoming 3 – 5 due to rain and mist

Wind (kts): W 5-10, becoming NW 20-30, gusting to 40

Min Temp: 4°C / 39°F

Min Wind Chill: -3°C / 27°F

Sky: Cloudy

Visibility (SM): 3 – 5 due to rain and mist, occasionally Unrestricted

Wind (kts): NW 15-25

Max Temp: 5°C / 41°F

Min Wind Chill: -2°C / 28°F
