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REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

A large low pressure system in the Bellingshausen Sea is parked offshore from Anvers Island and will slowly weaken in place through the forecast period. Ample wind and rain will be in and out, with the winds finally letting up later in the day tomorrow. Northerly flow will usher in warmer temperatures, making for wetter precipitation.
