PALMER STATION WEATHER FORECAST INFORMATION

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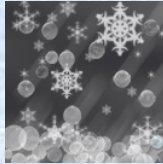
REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

Weakening low pressure in the Bellingshausen Sea will continue to bring strong, gusty winds to Anvers Island, coupled with heavy rain. As the low falls apart, the winds will die down for tonight and tomorrow, but the onslaught of rain will continue. Temperatures will once again drop when the northerly winds slow down, and this will turn the rain into a wet sleet.

Sky: Cloudy

Visibility (SM): 1 – 3 due to rain and mist, occasionally Unrestricted

Wind (kts): N 20-30, occasionally gusting to 50, becoming Light and Variable

Max Temp: 5°C / 41°F

Sky: Cloudy

Visibility (SM): Unrestricted, occasionally 2 – 4 due to rain, sleet, and mist

Wind (kts): Light and Variable, becoming NE 5-10

Min Temp: 1°C / 34°F

Min Wind Chill: -4°C / 25°F

Sky: Cloudy

Visibility (SM): Unrestricted, occasionally 3 – 5 due to rain, sleet, and mist

Wind (kts): NE 5-10

Max Temp: 2°C / 36°F
