A high pressure ridge weakens over the northern Antarctic Peninsula and moves to the northeast as a low pressure system intensifies in the southern Bellingshausen Sea. Indications are for west-northwest winds strengthening late today with periods of precipitation reducing visibility. Expect strong west-northwest winds with persistent precipitation, heavy at times, tonight and tomorrow as the low pressure center intensifies and advances from the southwest towards Anvers Island.
