Two areas of low pressure to the south of station, on both sides of the Antarctic Peninsula, are providing west to northwest gusty winds over Anvers Island today, then shifting back to the north-northeast and decreasing tomorrow as the low on the east coast, over the Weddell Sea, becomes the dominant feature.
