**REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY**

Weak high pressure ridging along the west coast of the Antarctic Peninsula today between low pressure over the Weddell Sea and a broad area of low pressure developing to the southwest of the Bellingshausen Sea. Indications are for favorable weather conditions with winds north-northeast, becoming light and variable, with early morning snow showers today and then ahead of next system late tomorrow.
