REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

An intense low pressure system persists in the Bellingshausen Sea near Alexander Island today and sends a series of low pressure troughs into the western coast of the Antarctic Peninsula and Drake Passage. Indications are for strong and gusty north-northeast winds today, occasionally gusting 50+ knots overnight with steady precipitation, weakening tomorrow as the system interacts with the land mass.
