REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

One low pressure system crosses the Antarctic Peninsula and moves into the Weddell Sea today while a second intensifies in the Bellingshausen Sea and moves up the west coast of the Antarctic Peninsula. Indications are for strong west winds with precipitation today with some breaks overnight late. By midmorning tomorrow expect stronger north-northeast winds and precipitation as second low approaches.
