PALMER STATION WEATHER FORECAST INFORMATION

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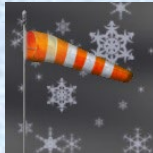
REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

Low pressure is in place over Anvers Island, maintaining strong winds and overcast skies. With temperatures flirting with the melting point, any precipitation will be a mix of snow and wet sleet. Later tonight and into tomorrow, the winds back down a bit as the low pressure weakens, which will improve visibility.

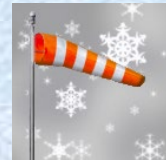

Visibility (SM): 1 – 3 due to snow, sleet, and blowing snow, becoming 3 – 5

Wind (kts): NE 25-35, gusting to 45, becoming NE 10-20, gusting to 25

Max Temp: 0°C / 32°F

Min Wind Chill: -15°C / 5°F

Sky: Cloudy

Visibility (SM): 4 – 6 due to light snow, sleet, and blowing snow, becoming 2 – 4

Wind (kts): NE 10-20, gusting to 25

Min Temp: -4°C / 25°F

Min Wind Chill: -12°C / 10°F

Sky: Cloudy

Visibility (SM): Unrestricted, becoming 3 – 5 due to snow and sleet

Wind (kts): N-NE 10-20

Max Temp: 0°C / 32°F

Min Wind Chill: -12°C / 10°F
