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REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

A low pressure system will be crashing into Anvers Island today, bringing gusty winds and a healthy dose of new snow through the period. Visibility will be up and down at times as the waves of snow move through. The initially-northern winds will sustain warmer temperatures through tonight, leading to a mix of wet snow and sleet, while tomorrow's wind shift to the southwest will drop temperatures quite noticeably. Wind chills will remain on the cold side through the period due to the strong winds.

Sky: Cloudy

Visibility (SM): Unrestricted, occasionally 3 – 5 due to light snow, sleet, and blowing snow

Wind (kts): N-NE 10-20, becoming 30-40

Max Temp: 0°C / 32°F

Min Wind Chill: -12°C / 10°F

Sky: Cloudy

Visibility (SM): 1/2 – 2 due to snow, blowing snow, and mist, occasionally 4 – 6

Wind (kts): N 25-35, gusting to 45

Min Temp: -2°C / 28°F

Min Wind Chill: -12°C / 10°F

Sky: Cloudy

Visibility (SM): 2 – 4 due to snow, blowing snow, and mist, becoming 4 – 6

Wind (kts): NW 20-30, gusting to 40, becoming W 15-25

Max Temp: -2°C / 28°F

Min Wind Chill: -15°C / 5°F
