**PALMER STATION WEATHER FORECAST INFORMATION**

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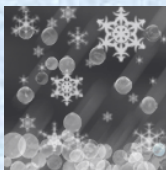
**REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY**

A series of low pressure centers is pushing into the southern Antarctic Peninsula. Today's low will bring gusty winds, a good dose of snow/sleet, and positive temperatures to Anvers Island. Later tonight, the wind and snow intensities back down, transitioning into a fairly calm and pleasant day tomorrow. But enjoy it while you've got it – the next low pressure center will already be knocking on the door by the end of tomorrow...

**Sky:** Cloudy

**Visibility (SM):** 1/2 – 2 due to snow, blowing snow, and sleet, occasionally 4 – 6

**Wind (kts):** N 25-35, gusting to 40, becoming NW 10-15, gusting to 20

**Max Temp:** 1°C / 34°F

**Min Wind Chill:** -12°C / 10°F

**Sky:** Cloudy

**Visibility (SM):** Unrestricted, occasionally 2 – 4 due to snow, sleet, and mist

**Wind (kts):** NW 8 – 12, gusting to 20

**Min Temp:** -2°C / 28°F

**Min Wind Chill:** -8°C / 18°F

**Sky:** Cloudy, becoming Mostly Cloudy

**Visibility (SM):** Unrestricted, occasionally 3 – 5 due to mist and light snow

**Wind (kts):** Light and Variable

**Max Temp:** -1°C / 30°F

**Min Wind Chill:** -6°C / 21°F
