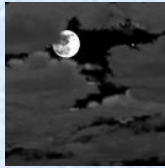
REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

The low impacting Anvers Island moves northeast away from the peninsula and high pressure builds over the region. By the late evening winds will have significantly tapered off. Overnight, a weaker low progresses towards the peninsula and pushes bands of mid and low-level moisture into the local area conducive for periods of light snow showers and reduced visibility.
