A high pressure around Anvers Island causes moderate cloud coverage and lighter winds throughout today and tonight. Tomorrow a trough moves through the Bellingshausen Sea across the Antarctic Peninsula, bringing in moderate winds and snowfall, reducing visibility in the afternoon.
