**REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY**

A deep low to the west and its associated frontal boundary will be the main feature driving conditions the next couple days. Winds will increase throughout the day, peaking overnight tonight. The front will also bring increased cloudiness and poor visibility in snow. A strong high to the east is blocking the low from progressing through the Drake, so it will begin to weaken tomorrow.
