PALMER STATION WEATHER FORECAST INFORMATION

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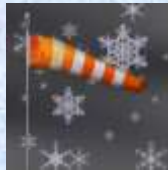
REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

Heavy snow and gusty northwesterly winds are expected today and tonight, as a deep low to the west slams into the Antarctic Peninsula. A strong ridge of high pressure will build into the region tomorrow morning, ending the snow but ushering in a further increase in winds. Additionally, a southwesterly shift in the winds will cause a drop in temperatures.

Sky: Cloudy

Visibility (SM): Unrestricted, becoming ¼ - 1 in Heavy Snow

Wind (kts): Variable 4-7, becoming NW 15-20, gusting to 30

Max Temp: -4°C / 25°F

Min Wind Chill: -18°C / 0°F

Sky: Cloudy

Visibility (SM): ½ - 2 in Snow

Wind (kts): NW 18-23, gusts to 35, becoming SW-W 25-35, gusting to 45

Min Temp: -11°C / 12°F

Min Wind Chill: -24°C / -11°F

Sky: Cloudy, becoming Mostly Cloudy

Visibility (SM): Unrestricted, occasional flurries

Wind (kts): SW 25-35, gusts to 45

Max Temp: -8°C / 18°F

Min Wind Chill: -23°C / -9°F
