REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

A high pressure ridge over Drake Passage and the northern Antarctic Peninsula will weaken and move to the east as a Low pressure system moves in from the west. Indications are for a wet and windy couple of days with strong north-northeast winds gusting up to 45 knots by afternoon as precipitation becomes moderate to heavy tonight. Expect winds decreasing tomorrow and shifting to the northwest with continued persistent low clouds and precipitation as temperatures remain above freezing.
