**REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY**

More of the same, these low pressure systems won't chill out. The first moves across the Antarctic Peninsula on Wednesday morning, keeping winds high with heavy precipitation for most of the day.

Ridging will briefly build, before a second low moves into the area on Thursday, giving similar conditions to Wednesday.
