**REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY**

High pressure continues to dominate the Bellingshausen Sea, maintaining a tight pressure gradient along a ridge moving through the Drake Passage. A wave of precipitation will pass through, clearing out tomorrow followed by moderate winds.

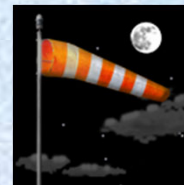

**Visibility (SM):** 1-3 snow and mist, becoming unrestricted

**Wind (kts):** SE at 15-20 gusting 30

**Max Temp:** -2°C / 28°F

**Sky:** Cloudy becoming partly cloudy

**Visibility (SM):** Unrestricted, with drops to 2-4 with snow and mist

**Wind (kts):** SW at 10-15

**Min Temp:** -5°C / 23°F

**Min Wind Chill:** -13°C / 9°F

**Sky:** Partly cloudy becoming mostly clear

**Visibility (SM):** Unrestricted

**Wind (kts):** SE at 15-20, becoming 10-15
