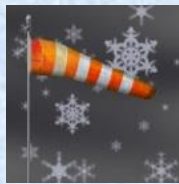
**REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY**

Low pressure will move across the Antarctic Peninsula on Friday, bringing strong winds and snowfall. A brief period of ridging will weaken the winds and precipitation, but a second low will move in on Saturday, causing winds and snowfall to begin and last through Saturday.
