REGIONAL WEATHER SUMMARY

High pressure will linger over the Antarctic Peninsula for the next few days. Winds will be light for all of Wednesday. A weak low pressure system will move in from the Bellingshausen Sea causing snow fall in the evening. Snow will last until Thursday morning when the low will begin to push out to the east.

Wind (kts): NE 5-10

Min Temp: -5°C / 23°F
