**PALMER STATION WEATHER FORECAST INFORMATION**

Satellite imagery shows fairly well-developed low pressure just west of Anvers Island this morning, poised to crash into the area with strong winds and snowfall. The system will slowly fall apart as it pushes through the peninsula today, and high pressure building in overnight will mean more favorable conditions tomorrow.
