

A cold front extends from the northern tip of the Plamer Peninsula through the Drake Passage to West of South America and is moving toward the coast bringing rainshowers and crossing your track early in the forecast period. High pressure will build over your track after 03/00Z producing stiff Westerly winds through the 3rd, with the next front approaching into the outlook period.
