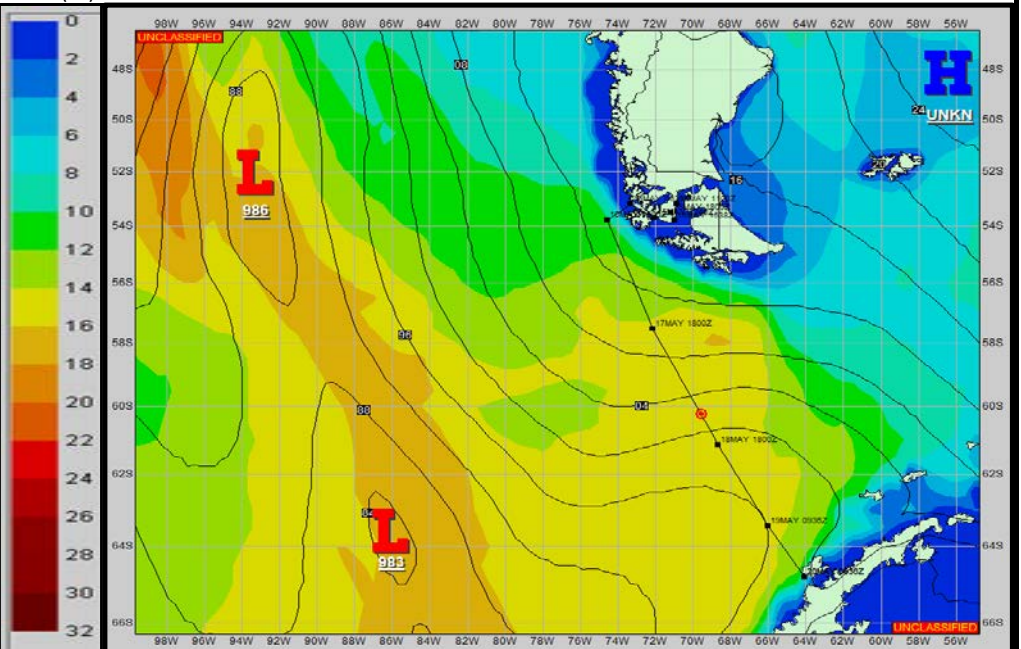
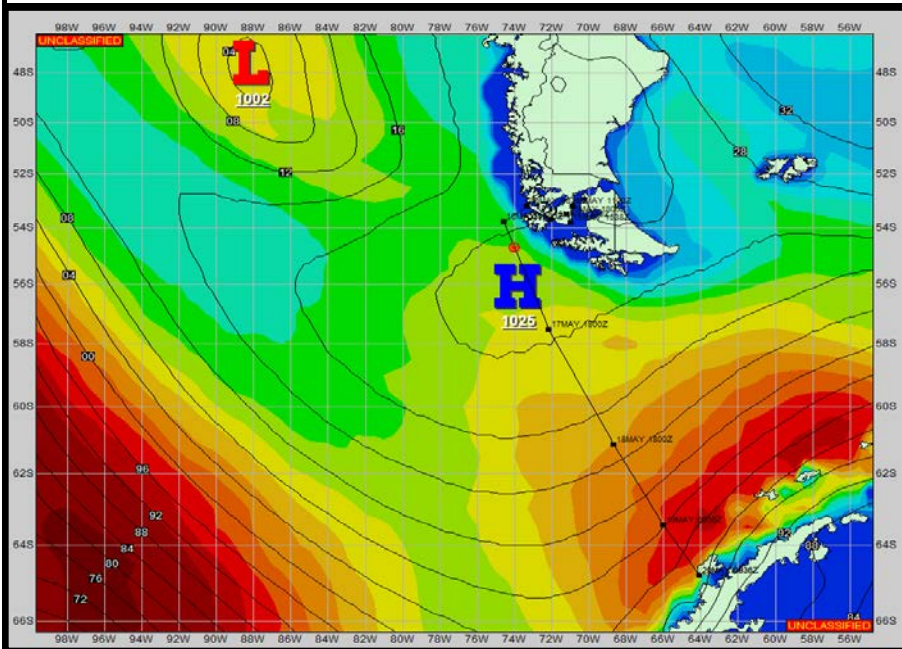


SURFACE ANALYSIS 17-May-2022 00Z

METSIT 00Z 17-May Initially high pressure dominates the route - but a low drops southward across the Drake this period, passing your location in the form of a trough (as seen in upper right pic) overnight tonight. This will stir up the strongest winds and waves you'll experience during this crossing, but seas are not expected to rise much above 15 feet and peak wind gusts should remain below 50 knots, all predominantly out of the north then west as the low passes by.

FORECASTER NOTES Winds may differ from those forecast due to funneling/sheltering effects of islands.
