

You'll set out into fair but cold conditions today, with snow showers in the vicinity; generally light snow showers will accompany you through the early portion of this trip. Things deteriorate a bit tomorrow as you head northward into a tight pressure gradient between low centers to the south and east and a high to the northwest. This gradient will generate strong winds and high waves, but your current plotted track indicates you will miss the worst of it. This pattern is expected to persist throughout your crossing, though it is also expected to weaken. (Additional graphics provided in the email accompanying this forecast.)
