

Snow & fog likely today, but tapering off overnight as a high pressure ridge moves into the area (upper right image). Winds should likewise trend to light & variable. After a period of potential morning fog expect a reasonably fair day tomorrow as high pressure dominates. A low approaching from the southesat could bring a downturn in conditions tomorrow evening, with snow being the first indication of its approach.

FORECASTER NOTES Winds may differ from those forecast due to funneling/sheltering effects of islands.
