

**METSIT 06Z** 13-Nov A 970 MB LOW WILL MOVE FROM THE BELLINGSHAUSEN SEA THROUGH THE ANTARCTIC PENINSULA LATE TONIGHT AND SUNDAY, BRINGING PERIODS OF SNOW TO THIS LAST PORTION OF YOUR VOYAGE TO PALMER. HIGHER WINDS AND SEAS WILL BUFFET THE WINDWARD COASTS IN ASSOCIATION WITH THIS LOW, BUT YOUR SHIP SHOULD BE LARGELY PROTECTED (BEING ON THE LEEWARD SIDE OF THE ISLANDS). A LOW PRESSURE TROUGH WILL APPROACH THE PENINSULA FROM THE WEST ON MONDAY, BRINGING ANOTHER ROUND OF SNOW AND HIGHER WINDS AND SEAS TO UNPROTECTED AREAS.

FORECASTER NOTES WINDS MAY DIFFER FROM THOSE FORECAST DUE TO FUNNELING/SHELTERING EFFECTS OF TERRAIN/ISLANDS.
