

THE LAST REMNANTS OF A RIDGE OF HIGH PRESSURE WILL KEEP THE BREEZE, CLOUDS, AND FOG AROUND A BIT LONGER TODAY. LATER TONIGHT, AS THE RIDGE TRANSITIONS TO THE EDGE OF AN INCOMING LOW PRESSURE SYSTEM, THE WINDS WILL QUICKLY RAMP UP AND BRING A HEAVY DOSE OF RAIN. ALTHOUGH VISIBILITY WILL BE SIGNIFICANTLY REDUCED AT TIMES, WAVE HEIGHTS LOOK TO REMAIN ON THE LOWER SIDE DUE TO YOUR PROXIMITY TO LAND.
