



A low pressure system in the Ross Sea continues to track southwards, strengthening its pressure gradient in between the mountains. High winds are expected along the ship's route with possible visibility drops in snow. However, very little precipitation is anticipated along the ship's route. As the low draws away, a high pressure system begins to form around the boat's estimated position, dropping wind speeds and scattering the cloud cover.
