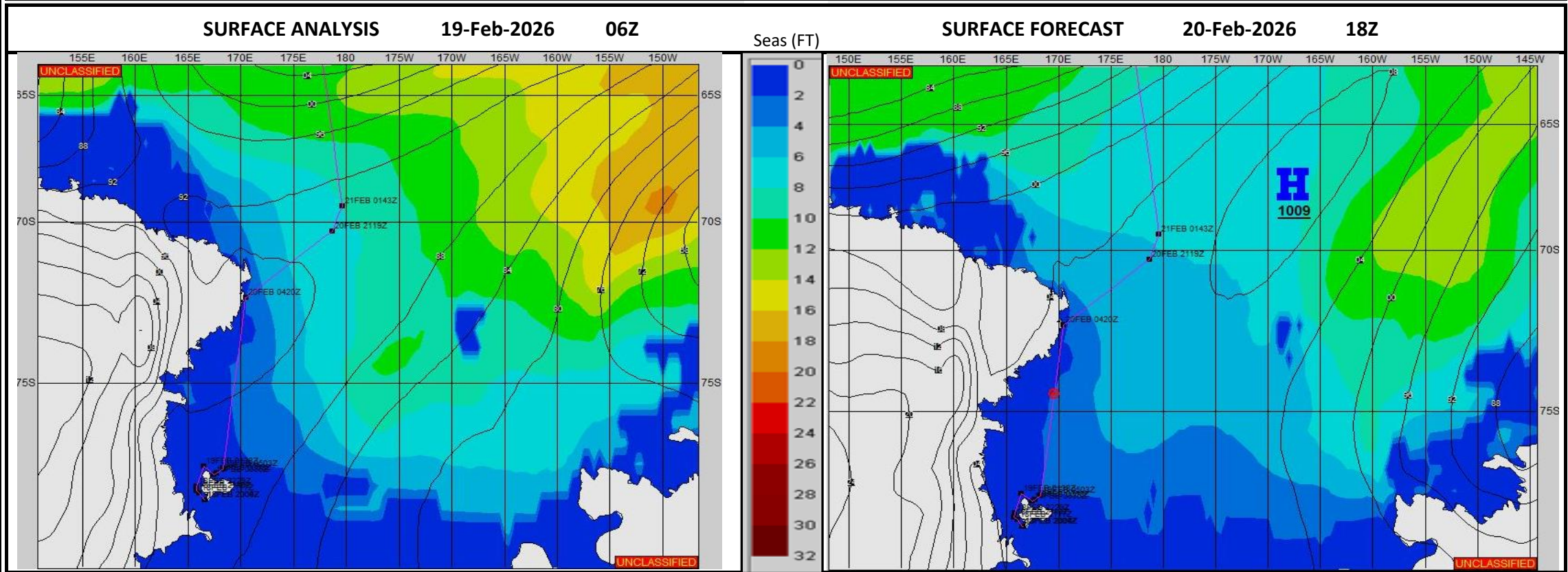

**METSIT 06Z 19-Feb** The strong high pressure flow is still present across the Ross Sea and Victoria Land. Areas of high gusting are still anticipated due to glacial outflow from Victoria Land into the Ross Sea. For the Plantijngracht, the strongest area is still expected to be just north of the Drygalski Ice Tongue between 75S-73S. Near Cape Adare, the winds are expected to be light and variable for the rest of the forecast period. Occasional sea fog banks may obscure visibility while entering the Southern Ocean.
